Oxford's 16th annual St. Patrick's Day Pub Crawl will take place on Sunday, March

16, with new organizers and additional activities aimed at enhancing the experience. For the first time, the Yoknapatawpha Arts Council (YAC) is hosting the event, bringing fresh elements while continuing long-standing traditions.

Typically held on a Saturday, this year's Pub Crawl was scheduled for Sunday due to conflicts with the Ole Miss Baseball schedule. "We're hopefully adding a little more playfulness to it—activities and a scavenger hunt with prizes to give away," said Wayne Andrews, Director of YAC. Participants will have the opportunity to win prizes such as coolers and t-shirts, and photo booths will be available throughout the event.

The Pub Crawl, which remains free to attend, will begin at 3 pm at Harrison's and end at Quack's. Those interested can register at oxfordarts. com. Andrews emphasized that the event is not just about visiting bars but also about engaging with the Oxford community. "The pub crawl is a great way to explore our town ... not just indulge," he said.

Organizers of the events are particularly excited about ending at

Quack's, as the business is donating a portion of its food t-shirts. sales that night to the Student Veterans Association. 'We're excited about ending at Quack's because they're giving back, and they just rebranded their menu, so we're also happy to help promote their food," Andrews said.

# Blues Scholar, Professor Promotes 'Beloved Community" in Memoir

The chapters of **Adam Gussow**'s life include teaching blues literature to inmates at **Mississippi**'s maximum-security prison and getting crowds grooving as a street blues harmonica player in **Harlem** 

The **University of Mississipi** professor of English and Southern studies weaves several of those personal stories into his new book *My Family and I: A Mississippi Memoir* (Post Hill Press).

Released on February 25, 2025, the book includes his reflections on the love that sustains his interracial family. Gussow is married to long-time UM staff member, **Sherrie**, who works in the School of Pharmacy. Their son, **Shaun**, is an Ole Miss freshman music performance major and part of the **Pride of the South** marching band.

The book challenges all sides of political and cultural ideology as he offers readers an intimate portrait of love, family, music, and hope amid a backdrop of persistent racial challenges.

"We're not the Ole Miss family or the Ole Miss couple that people expect," Gussow said.

"This is about an interracial family in contemporary Mississippi that comes into being. It's about a great love and the son we made and are raising."

A winner of *Living Blues* magazine's **Best Blues Book Award**, the scholar of blues and African American literature has authored several thought-provoking texts.

This time, he wants to interrupt narratives about race relations in the Magnolia State through a personal lens of his family's "fundamentally happy" story and historical context, he said.

"We're living a good life here and I hope telling the story of how our family achieved that in Mississippi helps people demystify (race) to the point where we're just living our lives in the pursuit of happiness," Gussow said.

"When the public hears those horrible stories about the six white officers down in Rankin

County, the world knows how to deal with that Mississippi story—and those are legitimate stories—but there are other positive things happening in Mississippi."

My Family and I chronicles Gussow's decadeslong commitment to the vision of Martin Luther King Jr. for a "beloved community"—a just and colorblind America where mutual respect and brotherly love prevail.

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


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# **Four More Years**

# An interview with Mayor Robyn Tannehill

All but one alderman and the sitting mayor **Robyn Tannehill** will serve another four years because no one chose to contest their seats.

The only election for alderman is for Ward 1 where Rick Addy stepped down. Drew Stevens, Erin Smith, and William Mayo will vie for that seat. There will be no primary and at the general election Tuesday, June 3, the top vote getter will be elected.

All this begs the question why so many city leadership positions have not been contested this year. I sat down with Mayor Tannehill to try to get to the bottom of this. While there are many theories regarding incumbent advantage, it might help to explore the mayor's record in the past eight years and her plans for the future.

# When did you first get involved in public service and why?

I first ran for Ward 2 Alderman in 2013. Five years before that I served on several local committees including the Chamber of Commerce and helped lead the bond initiative to get more school funding to build the new high school and improve our other public schools.

# What are you most proud of during your time as mayor?

I am most proud of my work on the committee to redesign our state flag. I was one of nine leaders in our state chosen to select a new design for the flag. I'm also proud of passing a new city employee minimum wage increase from \$9 to \$17.40 per hour in 2017. I believe this has improved morale at the city. We also created a new Development Services department that streamlined the planning and building process in the city. This new department helps coordinate activities in previously separate departments like Planning and Engineering that didn't always talk to each other before. This was frustrating for builders and developers and other city residents who often had to search for answers to their questions from multiple departments.

#### Why did you decide to serve another term?

I chose to serve a third term because my first term was marred by Covid. And protests over

George Floyd and other issues were a distraction from things I was trying to get done. Before I was Mayor, Oxford leaders didn't go to Jackson or Washington D.C. I started doing that and we now have obtained \$246 million dollars in the past seven and a half years for our city.

# What was the biggest challenge Oxford faced during the past four years?

Funding infrastructure necessary to support our growth has been the greatest challenge. Oxford now has a population of 28,000. On a random day in October we will have 90,000 people in our town. This is on a normal day. And during a fall football weekend we have 300,000 people.

# What do you believe will be Oxford's greatest challenge in the next four years?

We are the second fastest growing college town in America. So managing this growth will continue to be our greatest challenge. And maintaining our high quality of life. Also providing housing options for all our residents will continue to be a major challenge. We have partnered with the Rosedale Corporation on affordable housing for example.

# How many more roundabouts does the city plan to build? Why?

Two roundabouts are currently under construction and the one on University Avenue and Highway 7 is needed right now. We are planning a roundabout connecting Pegues Road with Commonwealth and Ed Perry Blvd. We are also planning to streamline traffic at College Hill and Jackson Avenue. And new roundabouts are planned at 800 Park and McElroy and at the entrance to M Trade Park.

Down the road there is also a plan to have a roundabout at Molly Barr and North Lamar Blvd. This will be part of the plan to improve traffic flow on North Lamar and Molly Barr Road as that area experiences more density. The Morgan building was the first three-story building on that side of town but we now have many more under construction. Ultimately this will create the need for more turning lanes and traffic signals in addition to the roundabouts.

# Do you think Oxford will allow high rise buildings at some point in the future?

In some places yes. But not in the historic downtown area. We already have zoning that allows for over four stories. For example, FNC before they were sold to Core Logic planned a multi-story office park along Highway 7 near Belk Road. And Jackson Avenue allows for this in places. Much of this came from our Vision 2038 plan where we sought to be proactive instead of reactive.

## What is the plan for handling additional traffic on North Lamar and the Commons and other areas as development continues to grow?

The key to traffic flowing smoothly is the North-South connection. And Ed Perry Blvd and the Pegues connection should help with that. And Pat Patterson Parkway. And the County is planning to connect Industrial Drive to Pat Patterson Parkway. All these things will help and provide multiple routes for traffic to flow. Eventually we may have a loop around the city even as far as Old Taylor Road and Thacker.

How can the city best address the home affordability crisis for teachers, police officers, and other essential workers? Is the answer partnering with the state and other local governments to improve transportation and housing offerings to/from neighboring cities like Pontotoc, Holly Springs, and Water Valley where the cost of living is lower?

Unfortunately, O.U.T. (Oxford University Transit) cannot connect outside the city because it is not allowed to be multi-jurisdictional. But this issue certainly deserves more attention, and we will continue to explore additional transportation options for commuters. Existing resources can be found at OxMS.net.

# Do you plan to run again? Would you consider higher office?

I have no plans at the moment but I also haven't ruled anything out. I am keeping my options open.

# This No-Knead Bread Recipe Is Great for Busy Families on a Budget

Get rolling in the dough with this amazing no-knead recipe that bakes up to four 1-pound loaves of tasty artisan bread for around \$2. I'm not kidding — less than \$1 a loaf! It's not only easy on your budget but also quick and effortless to prepare, as authors Jeff Hertzberg and Zoe Francois describe in their best-selling book that created a buzz far and wide: "Artisan Bread in Five Minutes a Day."

When I stopped by Zoe's kitchen, her active sons were home from school, shaping dough for their own pizzas. "Inventing nutritious recipes and eating together are important to our family," said Zoe. "When kids get involved in cooking and baking healthy foods, they'll eat what they make."

For the master bread recipe, let kids loose to measure flour, salt, water and yeast in a bucket. They'll love stirring up the concoction with a wooden spoon and their hands. Let it rise, and you're ready to bake bread for up to two weeks. You can even adapt the recipe for sweet breads, flatbreads and pizza.

Give it a try and discover the fun of rolling in the dough! Here's what you'll need:

- 3 cups lukewarm water
- 1 1/2 tablespoons granulated yeast
- 1 1/2 tablespoons kosher salt
- 6 1/2 cups unbleached all-purpose

flour

Mix together ingredients in a 5-quart food-grade lidded bucket or container. Cover loosely, let rise at room temperature for about 2 hours, then refrigerate for up to two weeks. Bake some of the dough now, if you wish.

To prepare a loaf, cut off a grape-fruit-sized piece of dough, sprinkle flour on it, and briefly shape it into a ball with flour-covered hands. Allow it to rest for 40 minutes on a pizza peel or a wooden board covered with parchment paper (or sprinkled with cornmeal).

Twenty minutes before baking, preheat oven to 450 F. Then set a baking stone on a rack in the center of the oven and an empty broiler tray on the lower rack. When ready to bake, dust the top of the loaf with flour. An adult should make a 1/4-inch-deep crisscross slash on top with a sharp knife and slide the dough onto the baking stone. Pour a cup of hot water into the broiler pan before closing the oven door.



Bake for 30 minutes, or until crust is browned. Let cool. Slice and serve.

# Moments in time

- On March 3, 1877, Rutherford B. Hayes was sworn in as the 19th president of the United States in the Red Room of the White House. Two days later, he was again inaugurated, but this time in a public ceremony.
- On March 4, 2004, Mianne Bagger, a golfer from Denmark, earned a place in sports history at the Women's Australian Open as the first transgender athlete to compete in a professional golf tournament, noting to reporters that it took a while to overcome the anxiety associated with the feat: "I don't know where my swing was. ... I was pretty numb the first seven holes. I couldn't really feel much below my shoulders."
- On March 5, 1839, "Jane Eyre" author Charlotte Bronte declined a marriage proposal from the Reverend Henry Nussey, informing him that he would find her "romantic and eccentric" and not practical enough to be a clergyman's wife.
- On March 6, 1475, Michelangelo Buonarroti, considered by many the greatest of the Italian Renaissance artists, was born in Caprese. The son of a government administrator, he became an artist's apprentice at age 13. He would go on to master painting, sculpture and architecture, becoming best known for masterpieces like "David" and his ceiling frescoes in the Sistine Chapel.
- On March 7, 2002, the defense rested in the trial of Andrea Yates, a 37-year-old Texas woman who murdered her five young children by drowning them in a bathtub. Less than a week later she was convicted and sentenced to life in prison, but the conviction was later reversed on the grounds of insanity. In 2006, she was committed to a state mental hospital in Texas, where she remains today.
- On March 8, 2014, Malaysia Airlines Flight 370, carrying 227 passengers and 12 crew members, lost contact with air traffic control less than an hour after taking off from Kuala Lumpur, then veered off course and disappeared. Most of the plane and all on board were never recovered.
- On March 9, 1979, the 26 Major League Baseball teams were ordered by MLB commissioner Bowie Kuhn to allow equal access to all reporters, regardless of their sex.



## One-Pot Lemon Garlic Shrimp and Rice: A Dish That's Easy, Elegant, and Surprisingly Frugal

Shrimp, once seen as a splurge, has become a frugal choice — not because shrimp prices have dropped, but because everything else has gone up! This seafood favorite is now an economical protein compared to the skyrocketing costs of beef, chicken and even eggs. Pair that with one-pot preparation, and you've got dinner that's easy on your wallet and your schedule.

One-pot recipes streamline prep, cooking and cleanup, leaving you with more time to enjoy your meal and less time spent scrubbing dishes. This dish is fast, flavorful and destined to become a weeknight favorite.

# ONE POT LEMON GARLIC SHRIMP

Yield: 4-6 servings Total Time: 30 minutes

16 ounces uncooked shrimp (41-60 size), thawed and peeled

- 1 fresh lemon, see note below\*
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 4 cloves garlic, minced 1/2 cup red bell pepper, diced
- 2 cups long-grain white rice
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1 1/2 cup water
- 1 teaspoon Old Bay Seasoning
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley

(optional)

**Prep the Ingredients:** If using frozen shrimp, thaw and peel before starting.

\*Zest the lemon, reserving the zest. Slice lemon in half, juice half the lemon (about 2 tablespoons juice) and slice the other half for garnish.

Saute the Garlic and Rice: Heat a deep skillet over medium heat. Add butter and garlic, and red pepper, sauteing until fragrant (1-2 minutes). Stir in the rice and continue sauteing for another 1-2 minutes until the rice begins to toast lightly. You might hear a faint crackling sound.

Add Liquid and Seasoning: Carefully pour in the chicken broth, water, lemon juice and half the lemon zest. Stir in the Old Bay and parsley. Give everything a good stir to combine.



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One skillet, endless flavor!

**Cook the Rice:** Cover the skillet with a lid and bring the mixture to a boil over medium-high heat. Once boiling, reduce the heat to low and let it simmer for 12 minutes.

Add the Shrimp: After 12 minutes, most of the liquid should be absorbed. Lift the lid briefly to scatter the shrimp across the top of the rice. Replace the lid and continue cooking on low for 5 minutes.

Let It Rest: Without removing the lid, remove the skillet from the heat. Let it rest for an additional 5 minutes. During this time, the shrimp will finish cooking, becoming pink and opaque.

Fluff and Serve: Gently fluff the rice with a fork, mixing in the shrimp slightly. Garnish with the reserved lemon slices, lemon zest and a sprinkle of fresh parsley, if desired. Serve hot and enjoy!

To save time, use pre-minced garlic or frozen shrimp that's already peeled.

Want to switch up the flavors? Try Italian seasoning with a sprinkle of Parmesan for a Mediterranean twist, or black pepper and grated Parmesan for a cacio e pepe-style dish.

Craving spice? A dash of Cajun

Craving spice? A dash of Cajun seasoning, or smoked paprika adds a

bold kick. For a fresh take, toss in fresh dill and a touch of crumbled feta. Love warm, aromatic flavors? Stir in a pinch of curry powder and a splash of coconut milk for a subtle, creamy depth.

Or go zesty with lime juice, cilantro and a hint of chili for a vibrant, Southwest-inspired version.

The combination of tender shrimp, fluffy rice and bold seasonings — whether it's zesty lemon and garlic, smoky Cajun spice or a Mediterranean twist — makes this dish a winner. We hope you try your favorite variations and love it as much as we do!
